ATTENTION COMPETITORS

Each competitor is responsible for supplying management with the correct numbers (USDF and USEF) for horse, owner, rider, trainer and coach (if applicable) before the start of the competition.

Show Pass: Effective December 1, 2022, rider and owner are limited to one Show Pass purchase annually (December 1-November 30); continued participation in USEF-licensed competitions will require a Competing Membership. Show Pass will be available for purchase on-line only.

Individuals, including parents on behalf of a minor, who are identified as a trainer or coach on the entry are <u>not</u> eligible for a Show Pass and must obtain a Senior Competing membership to participate in a USEF-licensed competition.

Coaches: Effective December 1, 2023, any individual (whether Professional or Amateur Adult) coaching a rider must have a current year USEF Competing Membership and be listed on the entry form, entry agreement and USEF Waiver of Liability.

LOW COUNTRY DRESSAGE CLASSIC I & II ENTRY INFORMATION

"EVERY CLASS OFFERED HEREIN WHICH IS COVERED BY THE RULES AND SPECIFICATIONS OF THE CURRENT USEF RULE BOOK WILL BE CONDUCTED AND JUDGED IN ACCORDANCE THEREWITH."

US EQUESTRIAN FEDERATION rules are in force from the moment show management allows access to the show grounds. This includes conduct, correct saddlery and equipment, and attire.

<u>USEF MEMBERSHIP STATEMENT</u> (GR901.9) Life, senior active and junior active members shall be eligible to participate in all classes at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions at the Modified Level or above and Combined Driving Competitions, Dressage, Reining and Vaulting Competitions and Endurance Rides. A nonmember may participate as a handler, rider, driver, owner, lessee or agent at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions, Dressage Competitions, Reining Competitions and Combined Driving Competitions upon payment of a Show Pass fee.

Participants in the following classes are exempted from the Requirements of this rule: 1) leadline; 2) exhibitions; 3) games and races; 4) classes for 4-H members; 5) walk trot and academy classes (academy classes are classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program); 6) USDF introductory level tests, pas de deux and quadrille classes; and 7) assistant handlers in Dressage Sport Horse Breeding classes.

<u>USEF Safesport Training Requirements to Compete:</u> (GR1303) Consistent with the mission statement of the Federation, the welfare of equestrian participants, especially minors, is of paramount concern. When any member -- athlete, participant, trainer, coach, organizer, official, volunteer, or staff member is subjected to or engages in abuse or misconduct, it undermines the mission of the Federation and is inconsistent with the best interests of equestrian sport and of the athletes the Federation serves. The USEF Safe Sport Policy, including the Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policies (MAAPP), found at www.usef.org, contains requirements for all participants in Federation licensed and endorsed competitions. Participating in a Federation licensed competition while ineligible to compete due to a SafeSport Training deficiency may result in forfeiture pursuant to GR703.1(h) in connection with classes competed in while ineligible. Points and results will be nullified and redistributed. Additional penalties may be imposed (see Chapter 7 Violations and Penalties).

Reminder: All USEF Life and Senior Active members, as well as participants who have regular contact with minor athletes, are required to comply with the U.S. Center for SafeSport training requirement to be eligible to participate in the competition. All participants must adhere to the U.S. Center for SafeSport Code, USEF Safe Sport Policy, and the Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policies. More information about these can be found at www.usef.org.

Conditions of Entry:

Every horse entered in the show is under the control of the Horse Show Management. Under no circumstances is the Horse Show Management responsible for any loss or damage that may occur, and it shall be a condition of entry that each competitor shall hold the Horse Show Management, Facility, and its Directors harmless for any loss or accident to the exhibiter's horse, horses or equipment, which may occur from sickness, fire or otherwise.

Complete Entries include the following:

- 2025 Entry Form with Rider, Owner and Trainer (mandatory) and Coach (if applicable) information complete
 and signatures provided and must be accompanied by funds to cover entry fees, stall fees and Federation fee
 (see GR208.1). In the case of a rider, driver, handler, vaulter or longeur under 18, his/her parent or guardian, or
 if not available, the trainer, must sign an entry blank on the minor's behalf. GR908
- A complete entry includes payment. Dishonored checks or declined credit cards require repayment before the show and incur a service charge.

- Effective December 1, 2023, all horses entered in USEF/USDF recognized shows must have a USEF HID (Horse Identification) number to participate. If riding in qualifying classes, the horse must have a USDF Lifetime Registration in addition to a USEF Annual or Lifetime Recording. These horse identification numbers may be obtained from USEF and USDF. Exempt from this requirement are horses showing only in Introductory Level, Pas de Deux, Quadrille, Opportunity Classes, Leadline, and Exhibitions. **GR1101**
- Federation Entry Agreement with Rider, Owner and Trainer signatures (mandatory) and Coach (if applicable.) The Trainer must be an adult. If Rider is under 18 years old, a parent/guardian must sign for the rider. Federation Entry Agreement is found after the Entry Form and with the Event on The Pegasus App.
- USEF Waiver of Liability with Rider, Owner and Trainer signatures (mandatory) and Coach (if applicable). USEF Waiver of Liability is found after the Entry Form and with the Event on The Pegasus App.
- The Show Pass fee must be paid by non-member riders, owners, lessees and/or agents. Legal guardians (including parents) signing as Coach or Trainer for their minor child must now be Senior Active USEF members in good standing per **USEF GR202.7.** Note that this does NOT apply to parents/legal guardians signing for the minor child as Owner or Rider.
- Freestyle class entries must include a copy of the qualifying test and music emailed to Show Secretary.
- Pony Measurements will be conducted on Friday, February 21st starting at 4:00 pm. Pony class entries must include the pony measurement card uploaded to The Pegasus App. If a pony does not have a permanent or current annual measurement, owner must notify the show secretary to schedule an appointment to measure the pony. The show veterinarian and Technical Delegate (TD) should be present when the pony is measured. Before any animal is measured, the person presenting the animal must have one of the following in his possession: the owner's USEF membership number, a signed statement that membership has been applied for, or proof of Equine Canada membership. An individual who is 18 or over must be present during the entire measurement process and the horse must be presented in a halter. The animal must have a USEF Horse Recording number or Horse Identification number. Measurements must be recorded on the Federation "Combined Driving and Dressage Pony Measurement Form (paper version, uploaded electronically). The information on the top of the measurement form must be provided by the owner/agent, who must be 18 or over, prior to the measurement taking place. It must contain the name and title of the person providing the information. (DR135)
- A negative Coggins (EIA) Report that was taken within 12 months of the show dates showing the same horse name as on the entry (**GR906.4**).
- At Federation licensed competitions horses, more than 7 months of age, entering the grounds must be accompanied by documentation of Equine Influenza Virus and Equine Herpes Virus (Rhinopneumonitis) vaccinations within six months prior to entering the stables. The horse name on the vaccination record must match the horse name on the entry. Please read the USEF Rule, GR844, for full explanation.

Changes to an Entry:

Any changes to an entry after the closing date will incur a \$20 change fee.

Late Entries:

Entries are charged a late fee for each show day entered after the closing date of February 14, 2025. Management reserves the right to refuse any entry. Entries may close early if time limits for judges are filled. Remaining entries are placed on a waiting list. Incomplete late entries will not be considered. Late entries may not be included in the show program.

Great American/USDF Qualifying Classes

- Enter a Q associated with the class to be counted by choosing the Qual Class.
- A competitor riding in the Open, AA, or Jr/YR classes must pay an additional \$20 USDF qualifying fee to have the score recorded for the GAIG/USDF qualifying division at that level.
- Riders must have an active USEF Competing Membership and a USDF Participating Membership.
- Owners must have a USDF Participating or Business Membership and a USEF Competing Membership (Junior Active, Senior Active, Life or Recorded Farm (with an Active Farm Owner).
- A Horse with more than one owner requires that at least one owner has both an active USEF Competing Membership and an active USDF Participating or Business Membership. For a business or farm to be the valid owner under this requirement, the business or farm is required to be listed as an owner of the horse with USEF and USDF.
- An Annual or Lifetime Horse Recording is required if you wish to earn points or qualify scores for specific USEF championships. A USDF Lifetime Horse Recording is required to earn points or qualify scores for USDF Regional Championships.

Non-Competing Horses:

- Horses brought to the show for experience are welcome. Rider and Owner complete the entry form online with Rider and Owner information complete.
- Rider and Owner signatures are required on the Federation Entry Agreement and USEF Waiver of Liability.
- Negative coggins and vaccinations are required as noted above in the entry requirements list.
- Payment should include the fee for a non-competing horse, the office fee and stall or haul- in fees. These fees are per day.
- Non-competing horses are subject to and must comply with the Drugs & Medication rules issued by the USEF but no D&M fees are required.
- Non-competing horses must wear the issued bridle number when out of the stall or outside of the trailer.
- Non-competing horses may only school in the warmup and competition arenas after show hours.

Horse Equipment Checks: (DR126) Exhibitors must present bridles and bits, if and when requested, to the technical delegate for inspection. The technical delegate must inspect at least 50% of the bits and bridles of horses entered in the competition. Technical Delegates must also conduct random ringside bit checks immediately after rides are completed.

<u>Office Hours</u> The show office and stabling will open at 12:00 pm Friday of competition weekend. During the show, the show office will be open one hour before the first ride until one hour after the last ride.

<u>Ride Times:</u> Stabling assignments and provisional times will be available at <u>www.ThePegasusApp.com</u>. Management reserves the right to change the time schedule after tentative times have been posted. It is the responsibility of the rider to inform the management of any time conflicts as soon as possible after receiving the schedule. **Official times** will be available at noon the day before each show. Check online or the official posting of ride times at the office for ride times. This show follows **GR830** with regard to rescheduled ride times.

<u>Schedule</u>: Classes may not necessarily be run in the order listed in the class lists. Current management tends to schedule FEI classes first followed by USEF levels in descending order.

Schooling: will begin at 12:30 Friday of show. All competitors must have their current issued bridle number before riding. Schooling on Friday will continue until 5:00pm. Saturday schooling will be available *after* the show until 5:00pm.

Hand-walking: of unmounted horses is allowed around the exterior of the competition rings from 7:00 -7:30 am. No mounted horses allowed.

Leaving the Competition: (GR1305.1 & GR1305.2)

No exhibitor may withdraw horses from a Licensed Competition after it has commenced, or remove them from the competition grounds, without the permission of the competition secretary. If an exhibitor voluntarily removes a horse from the ring without the permission of the judge, the Show Committee or Competition Management will disqualify the exhibitor and all their entries from all future classes at that competition and all prizes and entry fees for the entire competition will be forfeited.

<u>Numbers:</u> All competitors must complete check-in at the show office and receive a show number, before schooling or riding on the show grounds. Failure to check in at the show office prior to schooling will result in the issuance of a Warning Card. Competition-assigned numbers, or the same number in a personal numbering format, must be worn and visible at all times when a horse is being hand-walked, exercised or ridden, under penalty of elimination. (DR121.19)

USEF Waiver of Liability:

Anyone mounting, getting on, riding or trying a horse at the facility during the weekend of the show (including warmup day) must sign a USEF Waiver of Liability in the show office.

<u>Freestyles/Music</u>: Music for all freestyles should be emailed to the secretary. Sound checks will be conducted Friday afternoon. Other times must be arranged with show management. The times for sound checks will be posted in the show office. DR129.9 Except for USEF/USDF Championship classes and for FEI Pony Riders, FEI Junior, FEI Young Rider and FEI Para-Equestrian Freestyles, in order to enter a freestyle class at any level, a horse/ rider combination must have received a minimum score of 63% for Training through Fourth levels and 60% for FEI levels in the highest test of the declared freestyle level or any test of a higher level at a USEF/USDF licensed Dressage Competition or FEI recognized Dressage Competition or "open" Dressage class (i.e. open to all breeds) at a Federation Licensed Competition held prior to the competition where the horse/rider combination is entered to ride a freestyle class. A photocopy of the test verifying eligibility, or copy of the USDF score verification, must be submitted with the entry for a freestyle class.

Breaking Ties: (DR123.3): In case of equality of points the competitor with the highest marks received under General Impressions shall be declared the winner. When the scores for General Impressions are equal after coefficients have been applied, the horses must remain tied.

<u>Consecutive Levels</u>: Horses may enter no more than two consecutive levels, Freestyle levels included, at any one competition. Intermediate I & Intermediate II are not consecutive levels. Refer to **DR119.2** for levels chart.

<u>Classes per Day:</u> Horses are limited to a maximum of three Dressage rides per day at Fourth Level and below or two FEI Dressage rides per day. Horses competing at both Fourth Level and Prix St. Georges, or their equivalents, are limited to two Dressage rides per day. Dressage Seat Equitation, Quadrille, Pas de Deux and Materiale classes are excluded from the maximum limit of rides per day and horses in these classes may compete at any level for which they are otherwise eligible during the same competition. **(DR119)**

Opportunity Classes Horses, riders, owners, trainers, and coaches participating only in Opportunity classes are exempt from Federation and affiliate organization membership and Horse Identification (HID) requirements and non-member/Show Pass fees but are required to list the Federation membership number if the participant is a member. (**GR821.6**) Federation and drug fees do not apply. Horses entered only in these classes are still subject to and must comply with the Drugs and Medication rules and are subject to drug testing. Riders and/or horses entered in "opportunity" classes <u>may not</u> cross-enter in other recognized classes at the show. Participants must abide by all USEF regulations pertaining to attire, tack, and equipment for the recognized show. Only riders competing in Level 1 dressage competitions or in Opportunity classes are <u>not</u> required to wear a riding jacket or coat. (**DR120.1.2**) USEF rule **GR821** for additional information on opportunity classes.

Dressage Seat Medal Program: The USEF/USDF Dressage Seat Medal Program, for riders ages 18 and under, celebrates excellence in equitation and strives to develop a solid foundation for future success in the dressage arena. Riders wishing to qualify for the USEF Dressage Seat Medal Finals must compete in the USDF Dressage Seat Medal Semi-Finals held at the Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Championships. To qualify for the USDF Dressage Seat Medal Semi-Finals, a competitor must earn a qualifying score of 70% or above in any eligible Dressage Seat Equitation class (except walk/trot held at a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized dressage competition during the qualifying period or by qualifying for the Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Championships. The top two placing riders in the Semi-Finals are automatically invited to the Finals. More information can be found on the USDF website.

<u>USDF Regional Adult Amateur Equitation Program</u>: Rider must be an Adult Amateur (age 22 and up) and have a USDF participating membership at the time the qualifying score is earned. Horse must have a USDF Lifetime Horse Registration when the qualifying score is earned. To be eligible for the USDF Adult Amateur Equitation Regional Final class, rider must have earned a score of 70% and over in any dressage seat equitation class within the qualifying period or qualify to compete in any regional dressage championship class (excluding freestyles.) More information can be found on the USDF website.

Membership/Non-Member/Proof of Membership Fees: All participants (rider, owner, trainer, agent, lessee, and coach) must present to the competition secretary a current USEF membership number. In the event the participant does not have his/her membership number, he/she must submit online and pay the USEF show pass fee. All Riders and Owners must present a current USDF Participating, Group (GMO), or Business (owners only) membership number or pay a \$55 USDF non- membership fee per show. Those who cannot provide proof of their USDF membership may fill out an affidavit form and must pay the \$5 fee. The affidavit may also be used to verify horse registration and/or horse ownership. The USDF Affidavit Form may be found on www.USDF.org. Exempt from this requirement are individuals competing only in Introductory Level, Pas de Deux, Quadrille, Opportunity Classes, Leadline, and Exhibitions.

<u>Non-U.S. Citizens</u> and Foreign Competitors: Must provide proof, in English, of current membership in good standing in their respective National Federation or hold a current membership in good standing with the USEF. Equine Canada members in possession of current EC membership may sign for USEF Amateur status on a show-by-show basis at no cost.

MOTORIZED VEHICLE RULE: (GR1301.7): Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles, on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. The parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from that operation. Violations of this rule will be cause for penalties against those responsible for the child committing the offense. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

PERSONAL ELECTRONIC TRANSPORT DEVICES: (GR1301.8): The unsafe use of personal electronic transport devices, as determined by the competition officials and management in their sole discretion, that do not require a driver's license to operate, including but not limited to segways, hover boards, and single wheeled scooters is prohibited on competition grounds. Operating such devices in areas where people gather may be deemed "unsafe use" if there is a risk of harm to others. If the operator of the device is a minor, the parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating the device in violation of this rule is accountable and may be subject to penalties. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

<u>SHARPS CONTAINERS: (GR1210.4)</u>: Competition management shall place a minimum of one Sharps container per each competition, whether or not stabling is provided. Additionally, at least one sharps container per fifty occupied stalls for the disposal of needles and other disposable sharp instruments in convenient locations in barns housing competition horses. It is competition management's responsibility to replace such containers when full and dispose of them properly. **Competition management may fine any individuals including trainers, owners, exhibitors, or their agents up to \$100 for improper disposal of needles or other sharp disposable instruments.** Please do not use garbage cans for this material. If local law has different requirements, local law will prevail.

PROTECTIVE HEADGEAR (DR120.1.1): Protective headgear in compliance with the accepted testing standards published on the Federation's website. Protective headgear must carry the applicable quality testing tag and/or label. See **GR801**. From the time horses are officially admitted to the competition grounds by competition management, anyone mounted on a horse at any time on the competition grounds, including non-competing riders, riders on non-competing horses, mounted participants in exhibition classes, and those competing in all classes and tests, including Para Dressage tests, must wear protective headgear as defined by this rule and otherwise in compliance with **GR801**. The harness must be secured and properly fitted. Any rider violating this rule at any time must immediately be prohibited from further riding until the headgear is properly in place. Protective headgear may be the same as or a coordinating color with the coat, and may include contrast coloring, accent, and crystal decoration.

Equine Vaccination Rule: GR844.1 At Federation licensed competitions horses, more than 7 months of age, entering the grounds must be accompanied by documentation of Equine Influenza Virus and Equine Herpes Virus (Rhinopneumonitis) vaccinations within six months **prior to entering the stables**. Horses not in compliance with this rule may be required to leave the competition grounds upon request by Competition Management.

<u>USEF Drug & Medication Fee</u>: GR208.1 For every horse participating in any competition licensed by the Federation, a Federation fee will be collected (a portion of the fee shall be an Equine Drugs and Medication fee to provide for research, inspection, and enforcement of rules regarding use of medications and drugs; see GR407.1, .2 and .3. Exception: Horses entered in classes exempted from the Equine Drugs and Medication fee are also exempt from the balance of the Federation fee.

<u>USEF Interpretations of the Federation Equine Drugs and Medications Chapter</u>: GR408 Any questions regarding the interpretation of this Chapter, including the application of this Chapter to particular substances, should be directed to the office of the Federation Equine Drugs and Medications Program, 956 King Avenue, Columbus, Ohio 43212-2655. (800) 633-2472, (614) 299-7707, FAX (614) 299-7706.

<u>Liability</u>: Horses by their inherent nature present a risk. Neither the organizing/show committee, the show volunteers and staff, the facility or its owners, any host GMO, USEF or USDF or their members will be responsible for any damage, injury, loss to persons, horses, or property of exhibitors or spectators/attendees. All owners and competitors are personally responsible for damages to third parties caused by themselves, their employees, their agents or their horses. They are, therefore, strongly advised to take out third-party insurance providing full coverage for participation in equestrian events at home and abroad, and to keep the policy up-to-date. Each participant in an equestrian activity expressly assumes the risk of and legal responsibility for any injury, loss or damage to person or property which results from participation in an equestrian activity.

Each participant shall have the sole individual responsibility for knowing the range of his or her own ability to manage, care for, and control a particular horse or perform a particular equestrian activity, and it shall be the duty of each participant to act within the limits of the participant's own ability, to maintain reasonable control of the particular horse or horses at all times while participating in an equestrian activity, to heed all posted warnings, to perform equestrian activities only in an area or in facilities designated by the horseman and to refrain from acting in a manner which may cause or contribute to the injury of anyone. If while actually riding in an equestrian event, any participant collides with any object or person, except an obviously intoxicated person of whom the horseman is aware, or if the participant falls from the horse or from a horse-drawn conveyance, the responsibility for such collision or fall shall be solely that of the participant or participants involved and not that of the horseman.

<u>Accidents</u>: A participant involved in an accident shall not depart from the area or facility where the equestrian activity took place without leaving personal identification, including name and address, or without notifying the proper authorities, or without obtaining assistance when that person knows or reasonably should know that any other person involved in the accident is in need of medical or other assistance.

Important notice to all affected parties: Third parties may come upon the property or enter the facilities where any herein described or listed event will occur; provided, that this is a license to enter the premises, for the purpose of observing or participating in the event, but not otherwise, and such license to any individual is subject to revocation by the owner, lessee or organizer, and entry for any purpose other than granted herein, shall be deemed criminal trespass and subject to appropriate legal proceedings.

Dogs: GR1301.6

Dogs are not permitted to be loose on competition grounds and must be held on a leash. Individuals must not lead dogs on a leash while mounted. Dog owners are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from their dogs' behaviors. Dog owners failing to comply with this rule will be issued a Yellow warning card and may be subject to penalty **(Chapter 7)**. No other pets or livestock other than horses and mules allowed on grounds.

Class Division Explanations: DR119.3

For purposes of competition in the Dressage Division: Individuals are eligible as Juniors until the end of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 18. Individuals are eligible as Young Riders from the beginning of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 16 until the end of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 16 until the beginning of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 21. Competitors shall compete as Adults from the beginning of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 22. Individuals possessing current amateur certification are only eligible as Adult Amateurs from the beginning of the calendar year in which they reach age 22.

<u>Riders Under the Age of 14</u>: DR202.15 No rider under the age fourteen is permitted to ride a three-year-old colt, or stallion of any age, in any under saddle class including Dressage Sport Horse Prospect Under Saddle, Materiale, and Suitability classes.

Refund Policy Cancellations accepted only in writing by e-mail. Cancellations prior to or on the closing date will be refunded less \$50 cancellation fee and the office fee. **No refunds will be issued after closing date (even if closing date is extended)** except for fees collected on behalf of USEF (drug fees and USDF (qualifying fees provided all outstanding fees are paid in full; else it will be applied to those fees. Refundable fees will be mailed within 2 weeks after the end of the competition for entries that were cancelled.

<u>Scratches During Show:</u> DR126.2.b.3 Competitions may reserve the right to fill a competitor's subsequent ride times if that competitor fails to notify the competition secretary of their intention to scratch (i.e. is a "no show"). Competitors have the responsibility to inform the Show Secretary in the Show Office of their intent to scratch a ride prior to the scheduled ride time. Scratches will be accepted at the competition arena or with the Ring Steward but the competitor or representative must come to the show office after securing their horse to officially scratch their ride. Scratched rides are not refundable.

Hazardous Weather/Act of God/Accident Policy: GR305.4 & GR832.1 Management reserves the right to cancel any classes due to hazardous weather, Acts of God, accident, or emergency. Every effort will be made to reschedule with priority given to Great American\USDF qualifying classes being offered. No refund for cancellations due to hazardous weather, Acts of God, accidents, or emergencies.

AWARDS

Award for classes with 3 or more completed rides and six ribbons for all classes.

SCDCTA Member (Open/AA/Jr-YR) High Score

Sponsored by

Ribbon and award to be presented to the highest scoring Open, Adult Amateur, and Junior/ Young Rider SCDCTA member/registered horse pair riding in Training Level and above. USDF Introductory Level, Materiale, Opportunity, MFS, and DSE Classes are <u>not</u> eligible.

Thoroughbred Incentive Program (T.I.P.)

Sponsored by Linda Kelly

High Point Ribbon and Prize each day (must send/upload/bring to office T.I.P. registration papers.) Materiale, Opportunity, MFS, and DSE classes are not eligible.

KWPN High Point Award

Horses must be registered as KWPN or KWPN-NA and a copy of breed registration papers that say "KWPN" must be included with entry. Introductory, Materiale, Opportunity, MFS, and DSE classes are not eligible.

AQHA High Point Award

See AWHA website for details.

American Hanoverian Society High Point Award

Hanoverian and Rhineland horses, copy of breed papers must be included with entry. Introductory, Materiale, FEI Young Horse, Equitation, Opportunity, and Freestyle classes are not eligible.

International Andalusian & Lusitano Horse Association High Point Award

IALHA registered horse (Andalusian, Lusitano, S/P or half-bred) that earns the highest score during the show. To be eligible, registered horses must be owned or shown by an IALHA member. Provide IALHA registration and membership proof with entry. Introductory, Materiale, FEI Young Horse, Equitation, Opportunity, and Freestyle classes are not eligible.

National Dressage Pony Cup Partner Show Awards

Sponsored by Freligh Dressage

Champion and Reserve Champion Ribbons and awards each day for Pony Classes. Materiale, Opportunity, MFS, and DSE classes are not eligible.

JOVEE Farm Pony Class

USDF Statement on Animal Welfare

The United States Dressage Federation, Inc. (USDF), a federation of individual members and over 100 independent organizations throughout the United States, supports the concept of ethical treatment of animals.

Dressage is a classical method of training horses, based upon the horse's natural responses, as carried out in a gradual, planned program during which the horse's athletic abilities are improved in a systematic manner. As a result, the horse becomes capable, comfortable, and responsive in partnership with the rider without the use of force. Dressage competition at various levels of achievement is the ultimate test of the training program to determine whether the desired harmony between horse and rider has been achieved.

The rules pertaining to dressage competition prohibit the use of artificial appliances, training aids, and drugs, which would force the horse to submit. Instead, the emphasis is upon training and a cooperative partnership with the rider. Major competitions are carefully monitored to assure that there is no unnecessary force or harshness displayed.

Unlike other horse sports in which horses enter training at a relatively immature state, dressage training is usually not seriously begun until the horse is three or four. The top levels of achievement require five or more years of progressive training and it is not unusual to see horses in international competition in their late teens. This, in itself, places a premium on good care and soundness throughout the horse's life.

While supporting the concept of animal welfare in its broadest form, the United States Dressage Federation, Inc., also recognizes that it is unrealistic to ascribe human emotions and responses to the horse which in its wild state is a creature of flight, living a hard and precarious existence. Under domestication, the horse is assured of ample food, water, and shelter, as well as protection against infectious diseases and damaging parasites, thus leading a longer and healthier life with a high rate of survival.

As an educational organization, USDF has numerous programs, which teach people how to pursue the accepted, humane training methods. A program of certifying instructors also emphasizes protecting the horse's welfare in pursuit of dressage training.

Regional Adult Amateur Equitation Program

The USDF Regional Adult Amateur Equitation Program recognizes adult amateurs competing in equitation and promotes correct seat, position, and use of the aids in dressage. An Adult Amateur Equitation Regional Final class presented by Big Dee's Tack and Vet Supply will be held in conjunction with each of the nine USDF Regional Dressage Championship competitions, providing adult amateurs with additional opportunity for recognition. Ribbons awarded through 8th Place and gift certificates awarded to top four riders.

Adult amateurs wishing to qualify to compete in an Adult Amateur Equitation Regional Final may do so by meeting the following requirements.

Qualifying Requirements

To be eligible for the USDF Adult Amateur Equitation Regional Final class, rider must have

- a) Earned a score of 70% or higher in any dressage seat equitation class (except walk/trot) at a USEF-licensed/USDFrecognized Dressage competition within the qualifying period of the applicable regional championship.
 <u>or</u>
- b) Qualified to compete in any regional dressage championship class (excluding freestyles).

Membership Requirements

- Rider must have a USDF Participating Membership at the time the qualifying score is earned, and at the time of the Regional Final class.
- Rider must be an adult amateur, in accordance with GR1306 of the USEF rules, and be designated with USEF as an adult amateur when the score is earned, and at the time of the Regional Final class.
- Owner must have a USDF Participating or Business Membership when the qualifying score is earned, and at the time of the Regional Final class.
- Horse must have a USDF Lifetime Horse Registration when the qualifying score is earned, and at the time of the Regional Final class.

USDF REGIONAL Dressage CHAMPIONSHIPS

A single Regional Dressage Championship program organized by the United States Dressage Federation (USDF), and recognized by the United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. (USEF), will be held in each of the nine USDF regions. In addition, Alaska and Hawaii may each hold state championships if an official request from a Group Member Organization (GMO) is received by April 1 of the prior year. The Regional Championship Program Rules can be found on the USDF website at <u>www.usdf.org</u>. Please refer to the 2025 USDF Member Guide for the comprehensive list of rules and requirements for this program.

Membership/Registration Requirements for Qualifying and Championships

All memberships and registrations/recordings must be correct and current at the time qualifying scores are earned and at the time of the championships.

Rider:

- Must have a USDF Participating* Membership (PM).
- Must have a USEF membership (Active or Life).

Horse:

- Must have a USDF Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR).
- Must have a USEF (Annual or Lifetime) Horse Recording.
- USDF horse registration and USEF horse recording must be in the name(s) of the current owner(s) or lessee(s). A horse is not required to have breed registry papers.
- Horses must be entered in qualifying and championship classes under their official recorded names and ownership as specified in USEF GR1102.3, and transfers of ownership or lease registrations must be completed in compliance with USEF rules GR1105 and GR1108 prior to the competition in order for the horse to compete under the name of the new owner or lessee. (USEF DR127.2)

Owner:

- Must have a USDF Participating or Business Membership and a USEF membership (Active or Life Membership or Annual or Life Recorded Farm/Business). If the horse has more than one owner, at least one owner must have both active USEF membership and active USDF Participating or Business Membership and must be the owner of record with USEF and USDF.
 For a business or farm to be the valid owner under this requirement, it must be listed as an owner of the horse with both USEF and USDF.
- * PMs are USDF members who join USDF directly. USDF Group Members (GM) are ineligible.

Minimum Qualifying Scores: One set of nationally-standardized qualifying scores has been established for all USEF/USDF Regional Championships, for Training Level through Grand Prix, in three divisions: open, adult amateur and junior/young rider. The minimum percentages are as follows:

<u>USDF Membership Benefits</u>: USDF is dedicated to education, the recognition of achievement, and promotion of dressage. For details on member benefits, including educational programs, awards, and other opportunities, refer to the USDF Member Guide or the USDF website at www.usdf.org.

Membership Requirements for USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized Competitions: Owners and riders, including foreign riders

and owners who are not residents of the US, wishing to participate in a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competition as a rider or owner/lessee, must have either a USDF Group Membership (GM), Participating Membership (PM), or have a USDF Non-Member (NM) identification number and pay the USDF Non-Member (NM) fee. (Note: USDF Business Members can own horses but cannot compete as riders with their USDF Business Membership.)

Horses competing at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions must have either a USDF Horse Identification (HID) number or a USDF Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR). Proper credentials or verification certificates must be presented to the competition secretary.

Riders and owners wishing to participate in a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competition, and not able to present the competition secretary with verification of a USDF membership or NM identification, and USDF LHR or USDF HID, must complete a USDF Competition Affidavit Form and pay the \$5 affidavit filing fee. A copy of a completed affidavit form from another competition may also be used for verification purposes for up to 60 days. (Exception: Affidavits cannot be used at Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championships.)

Exceptions:

- Horses competing only in Individual Breed Classes (IBCs) at DSHB competitions, sires and dams of horses in DSHB group classes, where those
 sires or dams are not actually competing in the same competition, horses competing only in breed restricted dressage or DSHB classes at
 Regular Competitions (e.g. all Arabian, all Friesian, or all Morgan classes), or in USDF Introductory Level tests, pas de deux or quadrille, are
 exempt from this requirement. Also exempt are horses ridden in leadline, exhibitions, games and races, classes for 4-H members, walk-trot,
 academy, and opportunity classes.
- Riders and owners/lessees competing only in classes which are exempt from the USDF HID requirements are also exempt from the USDF NM
 identification number and NM fee requirements. Also exempt are handlers of horses competing in DSHB In-Hand or Group classes.

Memberships Defined

Participating Membership (PM): A membership issued to an individual directly by USDF. The membership year is December 1 through November 30. PMs are available for 1-year (\$100), 5-years (\$400), or life (\$2,000). A USDF Youth Participating Membership (YPM) is available for individuals who have not reached their 21st birthday by December 1 of the current membership year (\$80). A PM allows the member to compete at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions and to participate as a rider and/or owner/lessee for all Adequan[®]/USDF Year-End Awards and the Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championship program.

Group Membership (GM): A membership issued to an individual by USDF when the member name and dues are submitted to USDF through an affiliate Group Member Organization (GMO). The GM year begins December 1 and ends November 30. A GM allows the member to compete at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions and participate in the USDF Rider Awards Program.

Business Membership (BM): A membership that runs December 1 through November 30 and is issued to a business or organization directly by USDF. The USDF BM (\$280) offers a wider variety of advertising benefits. BMs satisfy requirements of horse ownership only.

Non-Member (NM) Identification Number: For each USDF NM owner/lessee and USDF NM rider there will be a USDF NM fee of \$55 per competition that must be collected by the show secretary and submitted to USDF, along with the USDF Report of Fees document and the \$5 affidavit fee and Competition Affidavit Form if the person cannot provide a copy of their USDF NM card. Owners/lessees or riders exempt from the NM number requirements are also exempt from paying the USDF NM fee. If there are multiple owners of a horse and all are NMs, only one of the owners must pay the NM fee. If the horse has at least one owner who is a current USDF PM, GM, or BM there is no NM fee assessed. Competition management will be invoiced for all applicable USDF NM fees not received with the USDF post-competition paperwork, along with a report listing all USDF NMs. Competition management is then required to submit the NM fees within 30 days to the USDF. An individual with a USDF NM identification number is not eligible for any USDF membership benefits. Once a USDF NM number has been assigned, a USDF NM card can be obtained from the USDF website.

Horse Identification (HID) Number: A one-time tracking number for horses (\$45). Scores earned by a horse with an HID number will be recorded but will NOT be counted towards Adequan®/USDF Year-End Awards. A horse with an HID number is not eligible to compete in Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional qualifying or championship classes. An HID number can be upgraded to a Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR) for a fee of \$95. If a horse has a USDF LHR it does not need an HID number. An HID number is a one-time fee that does not need to be renewed.

Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR): A horse with an LHR (\$140) is eligible for Adequan[®]/USDF Year-End Awards, and eligible to compete in Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional qualifying and championship classes, assuming requirements for the owner and rider are met. If a horse has an LHR it does not need an HID number. An LHR does not need to be renewed.

Applications for USDF Participating Membership (PM), Business Membership (BM), Horse Identification (HID) number, and Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR) may be found in the following locations:

- On the USDF website: www.usdf.org. You can submit the application online or download the form.
- In the show office at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions classified by USEF as Dressage Competitions, and Regular Competitions which are open to all breeds.

The effective date of membership is the date the form and correct fees are received in the USDF office or, if applying at a competition, the date accepted by the competition secretary, provided the application is signed and dated by the competition secretary, member, and/or horse owner on that same day.
